
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Pumpkin Soup



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- I tbsp olive oil
- I onion finely chopped
- Pumpkin peeled and chopped into chunks

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- Cup of vegetable stock
- Double cream

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- Method
- Heat I tbsp olive oil in a large saucepan, then gently cook
 I finely chopped onion for 5 mins, until soft but not coloured.
- Add the chopped pumpkin to the pan, then carry on cooking for 8-10 mins, stirring occasionally until it starts to soften and turn golden.
- 3. Pour the vegetable stock into the pan and season with salt and pepper. Bring to the boil, then simmer for 10 mins until the pumpkin is very soft.
- 4. Pour some double cream into the pan, bring back to the boil, then purée with a hand blender.
- 5. Pour into a bowl and en joy
