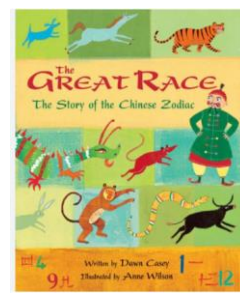
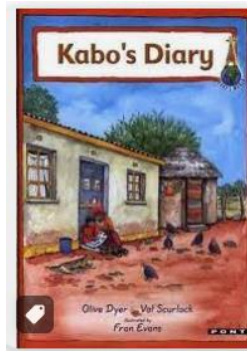

LANGUAGE, LITERACY & COMMUNICATION

- Pupils will complete a range of oracy, reading and writing activities covering the following genres in school and at home:
- Diary writing - Kabo's diary. Compare and contrast Wales and Africa.
- Non-chronological reports - A report about Africa/Wales.
- Instructional writing - How to make Welsh Cawl.
- Poetry - Easter acrostic poem.
- Welsh - Children will follow the Fflic a Fflac scheme (uned 3 and 4).
- Pupils will apply their literacy skills through enhanced provision all term.
- Pupils will continue using Reading Eggs in school and at home
- Digital activities provided through 'Seesaw'

EXPRESSIVE ARTS

- Watercolour Painting - Spring art using pastel colours.
- African Art - Children will create African inspired artwork throughout the term.
- Observational drawing of daffodils.
- Music - Children will learn how to sing and perform traditional African songs.
- Children will have the opportunity to develop their oracy and performance skills through role-play, green screen and the iHWB radio station.
- Easter craft and cards.
- Mother's Day cards.
- Eisteddfod competition - half term task.

MATHS & NUMERACY

- Pupils will engage in lots of practical activities using a range of resources to develop numeracy skills in school and at home.
- Pupils will develop skills in the following areas:
- Number - Addition, subtraction, place value, number bonds, length and data handling
- Problem-solving - Children will use the Badger Maths scheme to solve problems using the RUCSAC approach.
- Times tables - (Consolidate 2s, 5s, 10s)
- Pupils will apply their mathematical skills across all areas of learning during enhanced provision activities
- Pupils will continue using Maths Seeds in school and at home
- Digital activities provided through 'Seesaw' Pupils will engage in lots of practical activities using a range of resources to develop numeracy skills in school and at home.

HEALTH & WELLBEING

- Children will have regular circle time in class focusing on diversity and how people are different. Children will continue to do the 'daily check-in'.
- Children will take part in physical activity in school and at home through dance sessions in PE, outdoor play, the daily mile and Joe Wicks fitness videos.

- Children will use the outdoor environment in order to provide authentic learning experiences.

HUMANITIES

- Children will learn about famous Welsh castles.
- Children will look at a map of Wales and locate famous castles and Welsh landmarks.
